MISSION SUPPORT GRANTS

Unrestricted general operating support to Wake County-based arts organizations that provide specific types of arts programming throughout Wake County







PRIMARY ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Primary mission to produce, present, or support arts programs
- Non-profit arts/cultural org with 501c3 federal tax-exempt status
- Based and operate most programming in Wake County
- Produced programs in Wake County for at least one year
- Be in "Good Standing"
- Maintain board of directors which meets at least quarterly
- Have nondiscrimination, conflict of interest, and accessibility policies



SECONDARY ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Must meet at least ONE of these requirements:

- Arts programs specifically designed for youth
- Arts programs take place in Wake, excluding Raleigh
- Culturally specific org based on mission and leadership
- 501c3 status for less than eight years
- Arts service organization

If you are unsure: REACH OUT BEFORE APPLYING



NOT ELIGIBILE TO APPLY

- Orgs that receive direct allocations from the State of North Carolina in Session Law
- Orgs with budgets that exceed \$2M



GRANT REQUEST AMOUNT

Eligible organizations = **10%** of annual operating expenses from most recently completed fiscal year

Eligible culturally-specific organizations = **20%** of annual operating expenses from most recently completed fiscal year

Maximum grant request = **\$20,000**



CULTURALLY-SPECIFIC ORGANIZATIONS

Specific mission to promote, preserve, and enhance the identity and character of one of the following communities:

- African American
- Latinx/Hispanic
- Asian American
- Native American

Leadership must demographically represent specific culture identified.



WHAT GRANT CAN SUPPORT

- General operations, administration, or programming
- Flexible and unrestricted
- Efforts to fulfill your arts-related mission in Wake County
- July 1, 2024 June 30, 2025
- Specific expenses must be included in final report



WHAT GRANT CANNOT SUPPORT

- Deficit reduction
- Contributions to cash reserves or endowment
- Scholarships for use outside applicant's arts programming
- Private events closed to general public
- Projects of a religious nature



EVALUATION CRITERIA & SCORING



EVALUATION CRITERIA: Artistic Merit

Artistic Merit – 35%

- How does your organization define artist merit?
- How are your arts programs innovative, distinctive, and/or stimulating?
- Do you have professional and clear artistic direction and vision?
- What are the qualifications and expertise of staff/artists/instructors?



EVALUATION CRITERIA: Community Value

Community Value – 35%

- How have you continued to stay relevant to your community?
- Have you demonstrated an awareness of the needs/interests of Wake County's diverse community?
- What efforts have you made to include diverse populations?
- How do you fit into the arts community in Wake County?



EVALUATION CRITERIA: Financial Management

Financial Management – 20%

- Review audits/internal financial reviews and tax returns
- Considerations
 - 1. Deficits: Trend of accumulated deficits?
 - 2. Debts: Plan to pay off debts and still operate?
 - 3. Are there any concerning audit notes?
- Scores start at 10




EVALUATION CRITERIA: Org Management

Organizational Management – 10%

- Does your leadership reflect the diversity of Wake County?
- Do you have the capacity, resources, and planning to implement arts programs successfully?
- Are the personnel involved in planning/implementation qualified?
- How are the values of cultural equity and inclusion reflected throughout organization?




PANEL BREAKDOWN BY BUDGET: FY24




Panel 1 = Less than \$100k Panel 2 = \$100k - \$400k Panel 3 = Greater than \$400k No panel = Orgs less than 8 years



WHO SCORES?



HOW GRANT AWARDS ARE CALCULATED



EXAMPLE: GRANT AWARD CALCULATION

2022-23 operating expenses = \$250,00010% of \$250,000 = \$25,000Because this exceeds maximum grant request, reduce request to \$20,000Panel score = 85%Allowable request = $$20,000 \times 85\% = $17,000$

Total available dollars = <mark>\$300,000</mark> Total allowable requests of all applicants = \$700,000 \$300,000/\$700,000 = 43%

43% of \$17,000 = **\$7,310 = GRANT AWARD**

CHANGES FROM LAST YEAR

- Deadline by 5:00 pm
- Must have at least one year arts programming in Wake
- No minimum grant request
- No compliance score
- Less available funding
- Changes to application:
 - $\,\circ\,$ Shortened narrative prompts
 - \circ Program Reach: in/out of Wake
 - $\,\circ\,$ New financial narratives
 - $\,\circ\,$ NCAC Grant: Sustaining Support for Arts Orgs



IF YOU RECEIVE A GRANT

- Notifications emailed late June 2024
- Electronic contracts and signatures
- "Young" grantees will meet with staff
- Two equal payments: November and February
- Grant period: July 1, 2024 June 30, 2025
- Final report due July 2025
